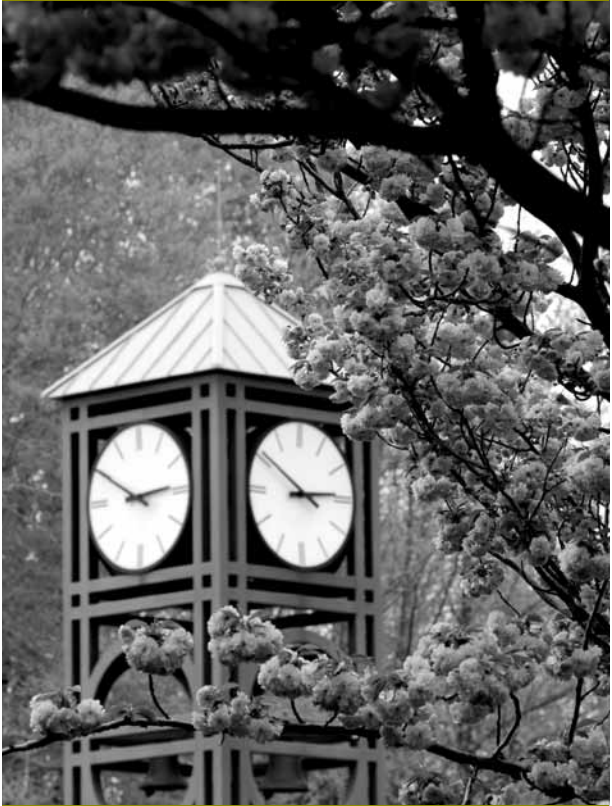

As a team, Theresa and Kim have presented collaborative workshops throughout New York State and Canada, highlighting the importance of an interdisciplinary approach between speech-language pathologists and audiologists when working with individuals with auditory processing disorders.

#### **Theresa M. Cinotti, M.A., CCC-SLP**

Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Communicative Disorders and Sciences at the University at Buffalo.

Currently, Ms. Cinotti is the Speech-Language Coordinator and one of the clinical supervisors at the University at Buffalo's Speech-Language and Hearing Clinic, a training clinic for graduate students pursuing their master's or doctorate degree in speech-language pathology. In relation to auditory processing disorders, Theresa oversees the Intensive Language and Auditory Processing Program at the university, an intensive summer program which addresses the language and auditory processing needs of children ages three to eighteen years. In addition, Theresa coordinates the adult language and auditory processing program at the university, a year round program focusing on optimizing processing skills and functional communication for adults with auditory processing, language, learning, and literacy issues. Along with one other colleague, Theresa is honored to facilitate student research for individuals who receive the Jack Katz Award in the department. The Jack Katz Award is an award given to select students demonstrating an interest in and propensity to expand the specialty of auditory processing research, evaluation, and therapy. In working with the recipients of this award over the course of several years, Theresa has expanded her own knowledge base and looks forward to sharing learned information with her audiences. In addition to her clinical responsibilities, Theresa teaches the Clinical Processes class for the department and coordinates and co-teaches the Clinical Practicum Lab. Theresa has served as Co-President of the Speech-Language and Hearing Association of Western New York (SHAWNY) for three years and currently remains an active member of its executive council.

#### **Dr. Kim L. Tillery, PhD, CCC-A**

Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Communication Disorders and Sciences at SUNY at Fredonia

Dr. Kim L. Tillery, Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Communication Disorders and Sciences at SUNY at Fredonia, earned her Ph.D. at SUNY at Buffalo, in 1997; and her master's and bachelor's degrees from Illinois State University. She has authored 22 peer-reviewed papers and chapters, including the recently published *Clinical Handbook of Audiology*, 6<sup>th</sup> Edition. She has over 120 invited national, state, regional and international presentations centering on the co-existing relationships of learning, attention and auditory processing disorders (APD).

Besides her teaching and research she has served as a Co-President of Speech and Hearing Assn of Western NY (SHAWNY) for two-years, received the 2003 Speech and Hearing Assn of Western New York Award for her dedication and service to the communicatively disabled of WNY, and served on other professional advisory boards and committees including two terms as a NYSSLHA Board of Director for Audiology. She was recently elected as the VP of Audiology on the NYSSLHA Board of Directors for 2010-2012 and President Elect for 2012-2013; awarded a 2008 Distinguished Alumnus Award from Illinois State University and the 2009 SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Teaching. For the past nine years she has provided hearing screenings to athletes at the Special Olympic events in New York, Canada and China.
