Our featured speaker is Marshall Chasin, Au.D., M.Sc., Reg. CASLPO, AuD (C) an Audiologist and the Director of Auditory Research at the Musicians' Clinic of Canada in Toronto, Ontario. Chasin won the 2003 Professional Leadership Award for clinical and research work with musicians and performing artists from the Audiology Foundation of America, in 1991 he received the Eve Kassirer Award for outstanding professional achievement from CASLPA, and Honors of the Association from OSLA in 1999. Chasin is the author of several books, including *Musicians and the Prevention of Hearing loss* (1996), *Noise Control-A Primer* (1999), *Hearing Loss in Musicians*, 2009, all published by Singular Publishing Group, San Diego, CA., and *Hear the Music*, 2001,2006,2010.

Learn about hearing loss, tinnitus, from regular exposure to music and strategies for musicians to conserve their hearing. This workshop is for musicians (rock n roll and orchestra), school and directors and their members, audio engineers, and the hearing health care professionals who work with individuals with hearing disorders as a result of exposure to music on a regular basis.
